









































As we make preparations for the Advent Season, much is being planned to make it interesting, informative, thought provoking and spirit filled. Sounds good; doesn't it?

As a church family, we will be looking forward to growing in our relationship with God as we worship and experience the Child in question, through the power of the Holy Spirit. That will be wonderful for all of us. But, what about those outside our walls? What about those that are lost and desperately trying to find their way in life but not knowing exactly where to look or what to do?


As Christians, this should concern us all. What we have learned in the Scriptures about sharing His Word with others and doing our best to prepare for the harvest should make us all want to do something about it. And, so we are. Something is being planned that will be an all-church effort.

On Saturday, November 25th, we will be having our usual time of the "Hanging of the Greens." This year, in addition to that, we are also going to have an Advent outreach, and everyone in the church family is going to be asked to participate in some way.

There is great power in prayer, and, if everyone truly commits to doing this, if we pray fervently, and if we take this endeavor seriously, we will see God move and, prayerfully, souls will be saved. But it is up to us. If we do our part, then we can count on God to do His.

So, begin praying now for our Advent season and for those in our community that need the Lord. May God truly bless in ways we have yet to see!



It's not easy to follow a legend in life – whatever the setting! We always seem to pale beneath the shadow of their legacy. I find myself in that position in two

different areas of my life. Pastor Al Conner is one of the finest pastors that Gloucester City has ever known. My Father, William Dilks, Esq. is one of the most well-known and respected attorneys in our community. Both of these men are devout followers of Jesus, who live exemplary lives of servant-leadership. Those are big shoes to fill, but I learned a lesson from Joshua – that when God calls us to do something, He faithfully supports us. I am certain that Joshua at some point thought to himself, "I am not Moses – who spoke face to face with the LORD! How can I expect to accomplish anything in comparison to this great man of God?" The truth is that Joshua is not Moses. Pastor Bill is not Pastor Al Conner, nor William Dilks, Esq. But God is still God, and God is able to accomplish great things through each of our lives when we are willing – for God is able! He promised Joshua that He would be with him just as He was with Moses. He told him to be strong and courageous, and to be obedient to the LORD's commandments. Proverbs 3:5-6 teaches this truth. When we humbly trust in the LORD's ability to fulfill His promise, then we can move forward with confidence believing that God is able to do great things through each of our lives. Joshua did accomplish great things for the LORD and was a commendable leader – the right person for the task that the LORD set before him. How about you? How are you doing in all the areas of responsibility entrusted to you by the LORD? Remember that God has placed you there, just like Joshua, to perform a special role or task that you can accomplish with the help of God. If the job seems too big, and you feel too small – remember that we have a big God who is able to achieve far more than we ever dreamed possible. Peter walked on water at Jesus' command; he began sinking when he allowed the circumstances to overwhelm him. Smartly, he reached out to Jesus who raised Peter safely to the water's surface. God is able and God is faithful – He is worthy of our wholehearted trust in all of life's challenges.

The pain of grief is one of the most intense feelings we can face. The emotional damage cuts to the soul. It can be overwhelming. You don't have to do it alone.


The second series of our grief support group began on September 14th. Grief Share provides help and encouragement after the death of a spouse, child, family member or friend. The group will meet weekly and includes:

## A New Way to Give TITHE.LY

## Download the app from your app store or click the "Give" button on the church website! (www.highlandparkcog.org)

It is really simple. Just use your smart phone to download the app and set up your giving through that. If you wish to give using your computer, just go to our church website and click the "Give" button on the top right. This will take you to Tithe.ly where you can set up your account.

When making your gift, please indicate any additional information or the breakdown of your gift in the memo line. You will receive an e-mail confirmation for your gift.

As with any credit card or e-transaction, there are transaction fees involved. There is a 30 cent per transaction charge plus a percentage fee that the church will pay. Bank account transactions are assessed a 1% fee, and credit/debit cards are assessed a 2.9% fee. (American Express, 3.5% fee.) These fees are paid by the church unless you click to indicate you would like to cover them. Whatever you decide, you will be credited for the full amount of your gift.

As I came back from Africa, I was thinking about you. In Tanzania, I visited a small village that had no electricity and no well. (They walk to a neighboring village to get water.) When we arrived, the entire village came to a worship service. We interviewed children. We were presented with gifts. As the Children of Promise representative, I received a chicken. The people of this village see healthy children who are growing in faith, and, because of education, they see hope that their children can have a far better life.

At the end, the chief of the village came forward and, in a ceremony, wrapped me in a Maasai robe. He presented me with a 'speaking stick.' When the chief holds the stick, people listen with respect. I emailed Paul Maxfield, our Executive Director, and I informed him that while he is a Director, I am a Chief! I have had great joy in my new title.

Yet, I know this is to be absolutely true. I was given this honor because the donors and sponsors were not there. I stood in their place. I stood in your place. You partner with Children of Promise and with the local village volunteers to change children's lives.

My honor was really for you. Thank you. Still, I'm keeping my title as Chief!
