



































Dear Church Family and Friends,

Another Year has passed, and a New Year dawns. The New Year reminds me of a quote from Lucy Maude Montgomery, author of Anne of Green Gables, 'Isn't it nice to think that **tomorrow** is a new day with **no mistakes in it** yet?', 'It's been my experience that you can nearly always enjoy things if you make up your mind firmly that you will." Learning from past shortcomings and resolving to improve

one's life are the impetus behind New Year's Resolutions. One year, my son resolved to go the entire year without drinking soda (carbonated beverages). He did so, but drinks carbonated beverages today regularly. Resolutions can teach us self-discipline, yet are they life-changing in nature? Personally, I try to take a balanced approach to my New Year's Resolutions. If something important merits change in my life, then I need to begin it whenever I sense the need to make changes in order to improve some area of my life. If it's about improving my health - then eating a healthy diet and regular exercise are part of making that happen. Those life or lifestyle changes will yield long-term health benefits. Folks have often shared with me the resolution to read the entire Bible in one year – that is an admirable goal. Still, reading 3 chapters each day and 5 on Sunday may make the completion of the reading of those chapters in God's Word the goal rather than understanding and applying God's Word to one's daily life. Absorbing what we read is an important part of comprehension and application. Spiritual resolutions are important, but they do not need a "New Year" to begin their implementation - just a renewed resolve to do those things, which improve our spiritual lives. Therefore, as this New Year looms large on my horizon, I am resolving to continue reading my Bible chapter each day, praying daily for others and myself, as well as looking each day for those persons that the Lord would have me to help along in life's journey. In essence, to embrace daily the message contained in the prayer of Richard of Chichester, as adapted for the song Day by Day in the musical Godspell -"Day by Day, O dear Lord, three things I pray. To see Thee more clearly, to love Thee more dearly, to follow Thee more nearly Day by Day."

#### A New Way to Give TITHE.LY


# Download the app from your app store or click the "Give" button on the church website! (www.highlandparkcog.org)

It is really simple. Just use your smart phone to download the app and set up your giving through that. If you wish to give using your computer, just go to our church website and click the "Give" button on the top right. This will take you to Tithe.ly where you can set up your account.

When making your gift, please indicate any additional information or the breakdown of your gift <u>in the memo</u> <u>line</u>. You will receive an e-mail confirmation for your gift.

As with any credit card or e-transaction, there are transaction fees involved. There is a 30 cent per transaction charge plus a percentage fee that the church will pay. Bank account transactions are assessed a 1% fee, and credit/debit cards are assessed a 2.9% fee. (American Express, 3.5% fee.) These fees are paid by the church unless you click to indicate you would like to cover them. Whatever you decide, you will be credited for the full amount of your gift.
